

The Bay Fall Classic U15 AA, A, B November 8th-10th , 2024 Tournament Rules

- 1. All games will be played under Hockey Canada and Hockey Nova Scotia rules. Protests are not permitted.
- 2. There will be no time-outs permitted in round-robin/initial round play. Each team will be permitted one time-out in semi-final and championship games.
- 3. Teams must prepare to begin a game up to 15 minutes prior to the scheduled start.
- 4. If teams have similar/same color jerseys, the visiting team will be responsible for changing to a different color.
- 5. All games will consist of a five minute warm-up, followed by three stop-time periods of 15 minutes, with ice resurfacing every two periods through the day.
- 6. Points are awarded as follows: 2 points for a win, 1 point for a tie, and 0 points for a loss.
- 7. If, at any time in the 3rd period of any game, a goal differential of five or more exists, the game clock will move to straight time. If the goal differential goes to fewer than 5 goals after that point, game time will not revert back to stop time and will continue to run straight time.
- 8. Minor penalties will be two minutes during stop-time play and will be three minutes during any straighttime.
- 9. Ties will not be broken during round robin/ initial round play.
- 10. In the event of a team unable to play a scheduled game, the other team will be awarded two points and a winning score of 5 to 0.
- 11. Ties at the conclusion of round robin/initial round play will be broken as follows: (a) record between tied teams; (b) goals for minus goals against; (c) goals for divided by goals against; (d) goals scored; (e) least penalty minutes; (f) a coin flip. **NOTE:** If more than two teams are tied, the highest ranked team will be determined first, then the tie breaking formula will start over to break any remaining ties.
- 12. Playoffs the top 2 teams in each division move to the semi-finals (crossovers) in the AA, A and B Division:
 - 1^{st} Black Division vs 2^{nd} Orange Division
 - 1st Orange Division vs 2nd Black Division
 - Winners of semi-finals will advance to championship game in their division.
- 13. If a semi-final game is tied at the end of regulation time, there will be a two-minute break followed by a 5-minute, stop-time, 3-on-3 sudden victory overtime period. Teams remain at the end in which they played at the end of the 3rd period of regulation time. During the 3-on-3, penalties will be served in the following manner: (i) the penalized player will serve the penalty; (ii) the penalized team will continue to have 3 players on the ice; (iii) the team on the power play will add a player to the ice. When the penalty is over,

the penalized player will return to the ice and play will resume 4-on-4 until the next stoppage when the game will revert back to 3-on-3.

If the game remains tied after the 5 minutes of 3-on-3, each team will switch ends, with no break, and play will resume with another 5-minute period of 3-on-3. During the 3-on-3, penalties will be served in the following manner: (i) the penalized player will serve the penalty, (ii) the penalized team will continue to have 3 players on the ice; (iii) the team on the power play will add a player to the ice. When the penalty is over the penalized player will go on to the ice and play will resume 4-on-4 until the next stoppage when the game will revert back to 3-on-3.

If the game is still tied after the second 5 minute period of 3-on-3, a shootout will occur to decide the game winner. In the shootout, each team will select 3 players and the home team will choose who shoots first. A 3-player shootout will commence. If still tied, a one-player alternating shootout will commence until an even shot-count winner is declared. Teams must use all players before any player may shoot a second time.

- 14. The home team for the Championship game will be determined by best record at the end of the round-robin /initial round play (using the format as outlined in #13).
- 15. If the Championship game is tied at the end of regulation time, there will be a two-minute break and the game will continue as per the tie format outlined in item 13.
- 16. Affiliate Players (APs) Affiliate players are permitted if they are:
 - a) identified to the Tournament Chair prior to the tournament start date (i.e., no affiliates will be permitted to be called up during the tournament),
 - b) not already on another team taking part in the tournament. A player may participate with only one team in the tournament. This means a player being used as an AP with one team cannot play with another team, and if a player is already on a roster for a team entered in the tournament, they may not be used as an AP with a higher level team.
 - c) replacing a rostered team player for the duration of the tournament (i.e., a rostered player who is missing one game but playing in others during the tournament cannot be replaced with an AP for the one game they are missing), or
 - d) filling in a spot where a team does not have a full roster (i.e., with a maximum of 15 players and 2 goaltenders, if a team roster only has 1 goalie or 14 players, they may use one (the same) AP for the duration of the tournament).
- 17. Suspensions during the tournament will be based on the Hockey Nova Scotia Minor Council guidelines. These guidelines will be applied to all teams from all branches.
- 18. The coach and manager of each team will be held responsible for the behavior of their players and staff, including damage to property.
- 19. Abuse of officials will not be tolerated and non-compliance will result in removal of the offending individual from the tournament and arena for the remainder of the tournament.
- 20. Coaches will be responsible for selecting a player of the game from their own team after each game.
- 21. Tournament staff reserve the right to make changes to regulations/schedule, if necessary.

OTHER:

<u>TEAM INFORMATION</u>: Teams must send official rosters and travel permit numbers a minimum of one week prior to the tournament start date. Please send to <u>tournament@tasa.ca</u>.

Upon arrival at St. Margaret's Centre prior to the first game for each team, a team representative must check in to receive a tournament package. The check-in area will be toward the back area of the main lobby.
